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Septic Education Program for Homeowners

Do you know how to operate and maintain your septic system? Of course! And now 190 Prescott Area homeowners do, too. Board members Lowell Fagen, Brian Bishop, Suzanne Ehrlich, Geoff Meek and Lou Brown have worked together to develop the first of its kind Septic Education Program for Homeowners.

The Septic Education Program for Homeowners was presented July 14, 2009, to a capacity crowd in Prescott. Attendees learned how their septic system works, how to recognize problems, how to maintain and effectively operate their systems to extend the service life and save money. Homeowners received an Operation and Maintenance Manual that was developed by the AzOWRA team.

The Prescott Community has had an on-going debate as to sewer or not to sewer certain areas of the city. As a result of these discussions it was decided to roll out this program for the Prescott community. There will be a repeat performance in September also in Prescott. The first presentation was co-sponsored by AzOWRA, City of Prescott, Prescott Creeks Assoc., and Prescott Area Assoc. of REALTORS®. The team will also make this program available to communities across the state.
